Aim

To allow first year physical therapy students the opportunity to practice information gathering, demonstrate professionalism, and interact with real patients.

Participation

You will be interviewed by 2 groups of 3-4 students. Students will interview you as if you had just arrived in their physiotherapy clinic for your first appointment. Questions will focus on your medical and social history. Your role is to answer their questions as honestly and truthfully as you can. You do not have to answer any question which you do not wish to answer. You will be given a feedback form to provide written feedback to the groups. Feedback will be given to the students in aggregate form (they will not know who said what). No physical examination is involved.

Background

Patients/community members with musculoskeletal issues (e.g. back pain, arthritis, joint replacement), chronic neurological (e.g. stroke, muscular sclerosis) or chronic respiratory conditions (e.g. COPD) who are interested in helping students develop patient interviewing skills. Prior experience with physical therapists is preferred but not required. Comfortable talking about your own health history. Ability to communicate effectively. Ability to provide constructive written feedback using a checklist.
