- 1. Will they support increasing access to the only other therapy, Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS), for people with advanced Parkinson's disease?
- 2. What is their position on increasing clinical resources for Parkinson's disease to reduce waitlist times?
- 3. What is their position on providing funding to train allied healthcare professionals in the management of Parkinson's disease?
- 4. What is their position on changing hospital policy and training staff to allow for people with Parkinson's to take medications on a personalized schedule, which will reduce complications during hospital stays?
